CHURCH GROWTH HISTORY FEEDBACK

In the May issue of the Christian Array newsletter I took available Church of Christ attendance data and proposed curves to fill in the blanks for a growth history. I commented that any comments from recipients would be published. The only comments came from Buster Dobbs, which ended up in an e-mail chain, which is reproduced below (in reversed order for readability):

By Buster:

We sow and water gospel seed, and God gives the increase (1 Cor 3:6), but it does not follow that this is only a two factor proposition.

Example: Noah preached righteousness (2 Pet 2:5). He made not a single convert and God gave no increase. Now, who failed? Noah? God? The answer is neither because there is a third factor: the people.

In the parable of the sower (Luke 8) Jesus taught the seed will fall on varying soils, and he also taught that each person is responsible for the nature of the soil of his heart.

By Benton:

God gave a judgment on the people before Noah – he wiped them all out and restarted the gene pool with Noah's family.

I have no doubt that there is a circumstance where non-growth is justified as it was in Noah's case. However, my observation is that it is not justified often. It seems to me that the uniform teaching of the New Testament is that we should be taking the gospel to the world. You went to a very old case in the Old Testament to demonstrate your point. I would think the parable of talents is a much more appropriate teaching for us to follow.

I believe we need to learn how to communicate

that God expects the church to grow, we are presently not growing, and this is what we need to do for the church to have sustained scriptural growth. As you might suspect, I am still working on the third part.

I would appreciate any insights you have.

By Buster:

You are right ... we should be taking the gospel to the entire world. There is, however, a difference in scattering seed and in counting noses.

The third factor is the people to whom the gospel is preached.

Jesus went to Nazareth after his baptism but had a negative response and no good results (Matt 13:58).

Whose fault was that? Jehovah? Jesus? or the people? ("because of their unbelief.")

Was the father pleased? Was Jesus happy?

Shall we blame Jesus and the Heavenly Father?

I do appreciate your zeal.

By Benton:

You make an interesting point which I have thought about a lot. We have a crystal clear concept that Jesus was the Son of God today. Jesus primarily made vague references to being the Son of God and to what the kingdom was to be to mostly uneducated individuals. In addition to being a really hard concept to grasp in real time, His plan was to fail and be crucified so that He could be resurrected.

With crystal clear knowledge, no persecution, and extreme wealth – do we have any excuse to fail? Can we keep sewing seed on rocky ground and complain of the results? Can we become self entertaining bureaucracies and justify ourselves because everyone else has become a self entertaining bureaucracy also?

Clearly we are ten talent people if they ever existed. I don't think one talent man results will play well on judgment day.

I appreciate your comments.

By Buster:

Thanks for your patience and understanding. Our job is to preach the Word of God (Mark 16:15-16). We throw the seed everywhere because, no matter how smart we are, we cannot read the mind of another. It is not for us to determine whose mind is hard, shallow, or good ground.

Even seed sown on good ground does not produce alike - some 30, some 60, some 100-fold.

When we fall into the trap of thinking that we are personally responsible for how someone else receives the message, we are headed down a blind alley. The next step is to feel guilt for not reaching the artificial goal we have set for ourselves, and the step after that is thinking that we have to tweak the gospel to make it more palatable to the listener, and that opens the door to apostasy. Our responsibility is to teach the whole counsel of God (Acts 20:27). It is not ours to force the result.

I feel the guilt, but have and will remain a strict

constructionist.

By Buster:

Our task is to "Go into all the world and preach *the gospel* to every creature ..."

Paul gives us this solemn charge: "Preach the word; be urgent in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching."

By Benton to readers:

Buster and I are old friends. Our primary focus differs on Buster's concern regarding over focusing on numbers to the point of sacrificing truth and my concern on focusing on numbers to try to wake the church up to what is (or is not) happening.
