# OUR IDENTITY-ARE WE LOSING IT?

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The church of Christ was generally restored in the 19<sup>th</sup> century with the guideline of "speak where the Bible speaks and remain silent where the Bible is silent". That statement or guideline more or less represents our identity. It is a form of an elitist attitude generally saying we see what the Bible says, we follow what the Bible says, and you are putting your salvation at risk if you choose to do something else. We cannot judge someone else's outcome on judgment day. However, our guideline would not allow us to give judgment day comfort to those who do not follow basic Biblical teachings.

Do not think it unusual that we have a guideline or motto for what we do. Everyone has a guideline. "I'm O.K., you're O.K." is a common guideline. About the only thing which offends the guideline is to suggest that someone else is not O.K. – which our guideline teaches us to at least imply.

Frequently, your greatest strength is also your greatest weakness. Our greatest strength has been the adherence to the guideline and it has kept the church of Christ as a reasonably homogenous group in spite of a lack of earthly hierarchy. On the other hand it has separated us from social acceptance with the rest of Christendom. As the rest of the world wants to be ecumenical and socially acceptable we have pretty much stood alone.

Our guideline automatically generates a negative reaction in most people, who consider it wrong not to be ecumenical. That makes it hard to be liked by most people in the world.

The church is presently drifting from our guideline. Some causes of this appear to be:

- Prosperity: There seems to become a greater desire for social acceptability in proportion to prosperity.
- The general "I'm O.K., you're O.K." attitude has been in vogue for a couple of generations and it is having more influence on the church than we are having on it.
- As it has been unpopular to say 3. things which would tend to proselyte others outside the church, we have in large part stopped teaching what would distinguish ourselves from oth-This has resulted in a generation in which a progressively higher percentage of members and not well grounded or tested in basic Biblical teachings. With the new generations not well versed in the scriptures, when decisions are made they will be made on personal preferences rather than Biblical teachings. **Decisions** based on personal preferences will tend to drift from Biblical teachings.

When we drift to a more socially acceptable guideline, we have a handicap. Some of us may be willing to abandon basic Biblical teachings to become more inclusive, but we still have the reputation of following the Bible strictly. This appears to be enough of a problem to some congregations that they took "Church of Christ" off the sign.

This makes for a quandary as to whether it is better for a congregation to stop following Biblical teachings and still call themselves a "Church of Christ" or to change their name. The first alternative has the problem of influencing other congregations, i.e. "one rotten apple spoils the basket". The second is an open door to further apostasy of the congregation in question.

For whatever reason, the Churches of Christ have lessened the teachings on "What must I do to be saved" in favor of more social gospel topics. Consider for yourself how long it has been since you have heard a sermon which couldn't be given at a Baptist or Methodist church.

At the opening chapel service at Abilene Christian University the local Methodist College President and local Baptist College President have been introduced as honored guests. ACU has been in business with the local Baptist and Methodist colleges in ownership and operation of a nursing school. Imagine that you introduce an ACU freshman to this and then tell him or her that they need to take the gospel to the Baptists and Methodists. Have we not traded evangelist zeal for social acceptance?

If it is not acceptable to proselyte the Baptists and Methodists, who are we to proselyte. The unchurched? Should we be concerned that we will offend the unchurched by implying that they are not OK?

There is no end to how far we can retreat from the basic guideline of "speak where the Bible speaks and remain silent where the Bible is silent". The question is why are we retreating at all. Does it not represent a subject of great importance?

Let us renew our commitment to the guideline as it is a commitment to the Bible and to Christ. We do no one a favor by not telling them the truth. We also do no one a favor by saying the truth harshly and repulsing them. We need to tell the truth with grace and concern for their souls.

When the doors closed, she couldn't take it anymore and stated, "Whoever started this whole Christmas thing should be found, strung up, and shot."

From the back, everyone heard a quiet, calm voice respond - - "Don't worry. We already crucified him."

For the rest of the trip down the elevator, it was so quiet you could have heard a pin drop.

Don't forget this year to keep the one who started "this whole Christmas thing" in your every thought, deed, purchase and word. If we all did it, just think how different this whole world could be.

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## **GROWTH RATE OF YOUR SERVICE AREA**

The population changes in your congregations service area are a significant factor in determining the effectiveness of your evangelistic programs.

Identification of what your service area is can sometimes be a daunting task. Your members will be concentrated in some areas and some of them will be widely dispersed. There is overlapping of some areas by 2 or more congregations. Other areas are not served by any congregation (When you identify that, you have identified a mission field).

#### ESTABLISH YOUR SERVICE AREA:

The most practical way to quantify your service area is to select 1 or more zip codes which characterize your congregation. A primary reason for this method is that historical zip code population data is actually available. There will likely not be a precise zip code or set of zip codes which describes your congregation. There may be other congregations which share your zip codes. What you are looking for is a representative and objective indication of the growth rate of your service area.

#### YOUR SERVICE AREA DATA:

- 1. 1990: Go to <a href="http://www.census.gov/cgi-bin/gazetteer">http://www.census.gov/cgi-bin/gazetteer</a> and enter the zip code(s) to get the population in you zip code(s) in 1990.
- 2. 2000: Go to <a href="http://www.zip-codes.com/">http://www.zip-codes.com/</a> and enter the zip codes to get the population in your zip code(s) in 2000.

#### CALCULATE THE GROWTH RATE OF YOUR SERVICE AREA:

Average annual growth rate =  $((2000 \text{ pop.} / 1990 \text{ pop.})-1) \times (100 / 10) \%$ 

If your 2000 population is 18,300 and your 1990 population is 15,000, then ((18,300/15,000)-1) X (100/10) = 2.2% population growth per year, average
