BE A 70/30 CHURCH

The typical church of Christ is referred to as being an 80/20 church. This generally means that 20% of the members do 80% of the work.

This is sort of a status quo situation which keeps the church operating, but not growing. It is probably characteristic of a lukewarm church.

To understand better what 80/20 means, let's presume that the congregation has 100 members. Presume the "80" do 5 hours of service per year which would relate to a composite workload of 400 hours of work per year. If this is 20%, the total workload must have been 2000 hours for 400 hours to be 20% of that number.

This in turn means that the 20 members do the other 1600 hours of work, or 80 hours each. This relates to approximately 1.6 hours of work per week average throughout the year.

Now let's presume the leadership of the congregation do what it takes to increase the activity to a 70/30 level instead.

If the 70 are simply encouraged to do the minimal work done by the 80 before, it would be 70 members doing the 400 hours of work per year. This would be increase their average workload to 5.71 hours per year instead of 5 hours per year. Better stated, it is 6.6 minutes per week instead of 5.8 minutes per week, on average. That should be achievable.

What is more interesting is that you have moved an extra 10 members into the more committed, more involved level. This does not say that the 30 more involved members simply divide up the work done by the 20 before. The 20 were committed to the cause and remain committed.

All 30 of the more committed members would now average the 80 hours per year for a total of 2400 hours of work done. This means 2400 hours of work from the more committed members and 400 hours of work from the less committed members. This gives a new total of 2800 hours of work to be done rather than the old total of 2000 hours.

This can be 800 hours not dedicated to the ongoing maintenance of the organization, but available to do new and evangelistic things. It is sort of equivalent to saying that you cannot support a missionary because all your income must make the fixed cost payments. When you have more than enough money to make the fixed cost payment, you can do other things such as supporting a missionary.

It can reasonably be said that if your church organization has settled into rut of simply doing what it takes to maintain the status quo, you are not doing your part of the Great Commission. If this is true, wouldn't it be better to lead your congregation on to bigger and better things? As a leader it is not simply better, it is your job.

Okay, I was just wondering, because I didn't get one either.





CHURCH GROWTH: COMMUNITY OUTREACH

An interesting article in which a University of Houston Vice President concludes that relating to the community is a key to students succeeding. Possibly this is a good component of Christians/ churches succeeding also.



John Antel, provost and senior vice president for academic affairs for UH and senior vice chancellor for academic affairs for the UH System, understands that the fortunes of the university and the Greater Houston community are inextricably linked—with each playing a key role in the other's success.

"We need the city and the community to support us," says Antel. "The community needs us to attract a twenty-firstcentury workforce and build the cultural capital in the community to attract the best and the brightest. We are partners, and our success is inextricably linked."

Antel, who had been dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences since July 2002, assumed his new role as provost and senior vice president/chancellor on February 1.

Antel joined UH as an assistant professor of economics in 1981. He was named an associate professor in 1988 and became a full professor in 1995. Among his numerous leadership roles, he chaired the Department of Economics from 1997 to 2002, and since 2004, has chaired the Undergraduate Enrollment Management Taskforce.

He holds a Ph.D. in economics from the University of California at Los Angeles and a Bachelor of Arts in political science from the University of California at Berkeley. Antel was selected as provost following a national search.

"I am delighted to have Dr. Antel as a key member of my leadership team as we continue to build momentum toward becoming a top-tier research university," says President Renu Khator. "Dr. Antel is highly respected in the academic world as a researcher and as an administrator, and he has a proven track record of promoting academic excellence and student success."

One key to student success is the hands-on experience gained through work in the community. For example, Antel says, UH's Center for Public History is working on a project about the history of the Third Ward.

"This honors the contributions of this important community and local school history programs, and it helps us do research and train graduate students," he says.

While there are several great ongoing programs in the community, Antel says he would like to see many programs expanded, with more student workers and graduate student trainees doing community-based research and clinical training in a variety of areas.

"While UH does not have significant financial resources to support all community programs, we do have a lot of human capital," he says. "We plan to use our expertise in various areas to reach out and serve this community."

JOE ELDER GOES TO JUDGMENT DAY

BACKGROUND:

Joe passed away and on his way to judgment day he ran into Jesus. Joe proudly identified himself as an elder of the Park Street Church of Christ from 1989 to 2009, and one of his proudest statistics was that he never missed one of the elder's meetings in 20 years. It was a strong congregation and kept the faith throughout his tenure as an elder. During his tenure, they had actually paid off the mortgage on their building.

Jesus said he was generally aware of that, and more information about the Park Street Church of Christ. Jesus commented that in 1989 there were 400 members, and in 2009 there were 400 members. The service area for the Park Street Church of Christ is generally represented by the 3 adjacent zip codes. These 3 zip codes represented 40,000 citizens in 1980 and 48,800 in 2009, or an average growth rate of 1%. This means that if the members moving into your area had simply identified with your congregation you would have seen a 1% growth. This growth would have been in Park City Church of Christ as there were no church splits, mergers, or plantings during these 20 years.

Jesus asked Joe if it would be reasonable to expect each of the 2 paid preachers to convert one person per year, each of your six elders to convert one person at least every other year, each of your deacons to convert at least one person every 3 years, and your other members to average converting one person every 25 years. Joe said of course that would be reasonable to expect. Jesus said that would work out to a minimum 6% annual growth rate (turns out Jesus is good at math in his head).

QUESTION:

Jesus asked Joe, if you understand what is said above to be reasonable, then you would agree that it was reasonable for me to expect a 1% plus 6% or 7% growth rate from the Park City Church of Christ. A 7% growth rate in the first year would be 28 members or an average attendance growth from 400 to 428. Compounded for 20 years this would be an average church attendance in the 20th year of 1547 members. As shepherd of the flock at Park Street Church of Christ, I think we can reasonably say that I expected 1547 members. Not only do I not see 1547 souls, but when you took your place as a leader of this congregation 400/40,000 or 1 in 100 citizens were a member of the church. After 20 years of your leadership only 400 in 48,800 or 1 in 122 citizens were a member of the church.

My question to you Joe is this: My Gospel is powerful and you were in a leadership position to direct the flock in your area. When your leadership style did not produce results in years 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10, how many years did you plan to keep on doing the same things which did not produce fruits? Where are the additional 1147 souls which you should have communicated the Gospel to?

THE RESPONSES OF JOE ELDER (TAKE YOUR PICK):

- You are simply talking about numbers and trying to keep score. We were focused on the fellowship of the congregation and the worship of your holy name. Jesus said – Did you read Matthew 25:24-30?
- 2. It was not socially acceptable to imply others were not saved during this time so we switched our theme more to love and friendship so people would feel at home at our services. We were doing good just to hold our own. Jesus said evangelism was not particularly acceptable in the first century either, in fact they crucified me. Did you read Matthew 25:24-30?
- 3. We told members to do things and appointed committees and ministries. The deacons and members simply would not cooperate and do anything. Jesus said that Park Street was clearly a ten talent church and the talents were not being used. You used a 19th century organizational plan to manage a 21st century church. I gave you plenty of years to learn the difference. Did you read Matthew 25:24-30?
- 4. <u>The ultimate answer:</u> None of the other congregations were growing either. Jesus said I find it interesting that the former elders from the smaller congregations around Park Street usually justify their non-evangelism because Park Street is not growing either. Did you read Matthew 25:24-30?

POSTSCRIPT:

If you think this article is intended to irritate elders, you are perceptive. If the church is to survive and grow, we must keep the gospel and make changes which actually work. Elders are called shepherds and members are called a flock or sheep. If the congregation is not growing the shepherds have the power to say that it is the fault of the sheep. It is probably more reasonable to say that the responsibility for the results is in proportion to the authority to do something about it. It would be unscriptural for the sheep to take on the role of being shepherds. The sheep will go to judgment day also, but their judgment will be different.
