### 61 CALLERS - YOU CAN HELP!

The **Oklahoma Christian University Think Tank—Closing the Back Door** is working both to develop new ideas to help churches of Christ growth, but also a method of getting those ideas to our 12,311 locally autonomous US congregations.

The distribution method is to recruit 100 callers to call 125 congregations and request the current e-mail address. We have presently recruited 39 callers and need 61 more. Testament mixed, and reading random sets of books and chapters. For 2015, we wanted to do something different. We looked to see how many chapters there were in the New Testament and found that there were two hundred sixty.

## 260 + 105 - P. 2

Our preaching minister suggested, "Add some prayer topics for the weekends". The plan then became known as "260+105." 260 days of reading and 105 days of prayer. Prayer topics are based on the previous week's readings and to aid in thinking about how it applies to me today.

The "260+105" plan is a simple plan, and since it only takes a few minutes to read a chapter a day. It gives you time to meditate, **highlight interesting passages**, research, take notes or journal entries about what is read. Read it individually, with the family, with friends, or as a couple. This can be used as a Bible class challenge with discussion, a small group study or any other idea to challenge, encourage and grow in knowledge of God's word. We are using the reading selections from the week as topics for the Sunday evening sermons at our congregation.

**At the end of 2015 each member who follows this plan will have the personal assurance that they know the churches of Christ follow the New Testament because they have carefully read it for themselves.**


The plan starts in Luke with the story of Jesus, and then Acts; the beginning of the church. After that, the progression through the books is in an order that makes the reading flow well. The last chapter to read at the end of the year is Philemon where Paul encourages Philemon and the church to keep up the good work of spreading the word and reaching out. We pray that this year, we will learn from the reading of God's word so that we can share the Gospel with boldness.

## IMPOSSIBLE FOR EVOLUTION: BLUE MORPHO BUTTERFLY




Two views (dorsal and ventral) of the same specimen

“With wings closed, the blue morpho butterfly (*Morpho peleides*) appears to have seven sets of eyes. As its common name implies, the blue morpho butterfly’s wings are bright blue, edged with black. The blue morpho is among the largest butterflies in the world, with wings spanning from five to eight inches.

**Their vivid, iridescent blue coloring is a result of the microscopic scales on the backs of their wings, which reflect light.** The underside of the morpho’s wings, on the other hand, is a dull brown color with many eyespots, providing camouflage against predators such as birds and insects when its wings are closed.

When the blue morpho flies, the contrasting bright blue and dull brown colors flash, making it look like the morpho is appearing and disappearing. The males’ wings are broader than those of the females and appear to be brighter in color. Blue morphos, like other butterflies,

also have two clubbed antennae, two forewings and two hindwings, six legs and three body segments -- the head, thorax and abdomen.”

The intricate and different designs on each side of the wings (especially the 7 “eyes” on one side) could easily qualify something impossible for evolution to do, however, it is not the subject of this one. The design of microscopic scales (small prisms) which reflect the light and make the wings appear to be blue is this month’s impossible. This clearly illustrates an intelligent designer rather than an accident of evolution.
