PROTOTYPE SHEPHERDS P. 2

As is indicated in lesson 6.8 CHURCH ORGANI-ZATION*, the qualifications of Shepherds are given in I Tim. 3:1-7 & Titus 1:5-9, and the qualifications of Deacons are given in I Timothy 3:8-13. The qualifications of Shepherds are more detailed, but there is not actually much difference in qualifications.

ROLE AND AUTHORITY OF SHEPHERDS

- * Congregational financial responsibility (Acts 11:27 30)
- * Send out missionaries (Acts 15:22)
- * Send letters of recommendation (Acts 15:23)
- * Represent the church to others (Acts 20:17)
- * Shepherd the flock (Acts 20:28)
- * Have charge over the flock (I Thes. 5:12)
- * Oversee (I Tim. 3:2, Titus 1:7, I Peter 5:2, Heb. 13:17)
- * Manage church (I Tim. 3:4 5)
- * Have rule over the church (Heb. 13:17, I Tim. 5:17)
- * Exhort (I Tim. 5:9)
- * Refute (I Tim. 5:9)
- * Pray for members (James 5:14)
- * Feed the flock (I Peter 5:2)
- * Public rebuke for continuing sinners is instructed in I Tim. 5:20. The responsibility for this would naturally fall under the supervision of the overseers or rulers.

This list clearly illustrates a comprehensive authority of the Shepherds over the local congregation, and there a resultant responsibility for the results.

There is no comparable listing of the duties of Deacons similar to the listing of the Shepherds.

What is normally taught is that Deacons are in charge of tasks per the example in Acts 6:1-4.

Acts 6:1-4 "Now at this time while the disciples were increasing in number, a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic Jews against the native Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving of food. So the twelve summoned the congregation of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable for us to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables. Therefore, brethren, select from among you seven



men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." (NASV)

As it is a completely reasonable understanding that the 7 men in Acts 6 were prototype Deacons, it may also be reasonable to consider that the Apostles were acting as prototype Shepherds. At the time of the events of Acts 6, neither Deacons or Shepherds had been defined.

Acts 6 is not so much instructive about what Shepherds should do as it simply says that the need to devote themselves to prayer and ministry of the word. That is repeated in 1 Tim. 3:1-7 & Titus 1:5 9. It is more instructive is what they are not to do. It specifically teaches that they are not to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables. They are to put other brethren in charge of this task, and by extension similar tasks or Deacon tasks.

GOD AS A PARENT, P. 2

Shepherds are to manage the church (I Tim. 3:4-5), which would imply that they are to delegate deacon-type work to others so that Shepherds can focus on spiritual guidance. If the Deacons or others do not adequately perform the delegated tasks, the Shepherds are to guide them. This typically means they are to mentor them to do the job better, or move them to a task to which that individual is better suited to succeed. That would additionally indicate that the Shepherds are not to do the deacon-type work which the Deacons are not doing well, except on a temporary basis as they are training or recruiting deacon-type workers.

This would suggest that if Shepherds are doing Deacon tasks, they may be, by default, neglecting the spiritual work of God: comfort and consolation and spiritual guidance of the congregation, prayer, and ministry of the word. If a Shepherd feels that doing deacon-type work is his calling, he might consider becoming a Deacon.

Instruction in godliness: God instructed His children to commit themselves wholeheartedly to His words. "Teach them [His principles] to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up." (Deut. 11:18, 19 NLT) This includes teaching children to obey their parents. Obedience is the foundation for our relationship with our heavenly Father.

A daily dose of discipline: When we love our children, we will discipline them. Discipline, of which punishment is one part, means providing instruction and guidance, and correction when necessary, until the child develops self discipline. "Those who spare the rod of discipline hate their children. Those who love their children care enough to discipline them." (Proverbs 13:24 NLT) How does God handle this as a parent? "For the Lord disciplines those He loves, and He punishes each one He accepts as His child." (Heb. 12:6f NLT)

The goal of a parent: God has such high aspirations for His children. He asks that we be holy as He is holy, love as He loves and grow in knowledge and wisdom. A godly earthly parent wants us to develop our skills so we can serve others. It will take a lifetime to become everything our parent, God, wants us to be. Make it your goal to, "Find out what pleases the Lord." (Eph. 5:10 NIV)

Generosity is one major part of goodness. It is unselfish and expresses itself through sharing. It extends to family and friends, strangers, and particularly those in need, and is offered not only as money, food and clothing, but also as time shared and assistance provided. In one's life; this is often described as sharing your time, talent and treasure.

Satan would not overtly offer these behaviors as desirable in his attempts to draw people away from Godly goodness. Rather, he might suggest to you is that being good, being generous, consumes too much of your resources, both time and money. And likewise, he whispers, those needing your generosity may not be deserving of your help; their station in life, or behavior, makes them undeserving to be a drain on your resources.

Satan might suggest instead that you spend all your time and money on making progress in

your personal endeavors, postponing help for those you may consider to be undeserving; you will reach your goals faster and will accomplish more. He even suggests to you that if you invest your resources in your personal life, you will be better equipped to help others in the future! Unfortunately, for most, once on that self-serving path, that future of generous giving never comes.

IMPOSSIBLE FOR EVOLUTION #130 - SPHINCTERS

Sphincters are so common in the human body and have such an obvious purpose, you might think it to be something which atheistic evolution could do.

A sphincter is a circular muscle that normally maintains constriction of a natural body passage or orifice and which relaxes as required for normal body functioning. Sphincters are found in many animals. There are over 60 types in the human body, some microscopically small, in particular the millions of precapillary sphincters. A precapillary sphincter is a band of contractile mural cells either classified as smooth muscle or pericytes that adjust blood flow into capillaries. The capillaries are found throughout all muscles, and are so small that a red or white blood cell barely passes through them. The opening and closing of the precapillary sphincters literally controls the blood pressure in the capillaries.

Sphincters relax at death, often releasing fluids and feces.

The graphic shows the lower esophageal sphincter between the Esophagus and the Stomach, and the Pyloric sphincter between the stomach and the Duodenum or start of the small intestine. These are two which you never know exist, unless you have a problem.


A sphincter you will be more familiar with is the urinary sphincter. The urinary sphincter is a muscle that surrounds your urethra. The sphincter squeezes the urethra to keep urine in the bladder until it is time to urinate. When it is time to urinate and you are in an acceptable location, it relaxes to allow the urine to flow. You basically control your bladder sphincter, even though you have no idea how you do it.

Your mouth would be another sphincter valve you are familiar with, but one you have conscious control over.

But why would we suggest something so com-

mon would be impossible for atheistic evolution to do? First it requires the circular design of a muscle placed in an appropriate location. Secondly, it requires controlling nerves to be in place to, under normal circumstances, keep the sphincter valve closed and then to relax it at appropriate times. Third, it requires computer programming-type logic to tell the sphincter valve when to open and when to close. Each of these three requirements are coded into the DNA of the sperm and egg at conception. Atheistic evolution simply has no means to program DNA to make this happen, and it is naïve to suggest that it does.

The complex design of this common building block of life certainly teaches the need for an Intelligent Designer.






