Luke 15:11-32 relates the parable we normally refer to as the "Prodigal Son." Most everyone is aware of it, so the parable will not be repeated

here. Because the title Prodigal Son implies that the parable is about the younger son who asks for his inheritance and leaves home. Also of the 22 verses the first 14 of tell the story of this son leaving only the last 8 verses to tell about the older son, and so it might seem the parable is about the prodigal son.

To many, this may be our least

favorite parable; it doesn't seem fair that the son who wasted his portion of his father's wealth in reckless living and with prostitutes would have a party thrown for his return, when the older "obedient" son did not receive a party. The parable lacks a feeling of fairness. Parables are an earthly story to explain a heavenly concept, and so do not always fit our limited earthly rationale.

FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT - FAITHFULNESS

When referring to the Fruit of Faithfulness, it is important to break down and

focus on the word "faith". Faith is complete belief and confidence in God and all His promises. It is critically important for us to allow God and the teachings of Jesus to shape everything that we do.

The fruit of faithfulness speaks not only of faithfulness to God, but of being faithful to the people around us as well. When

In a recent sermon by Wayne Roberts, he contends that the parable of the prodigal son was not about the prodigal son at all; it was actually about the older son. Whoever first (non-inspired writer) named this parable should have called it something else; possibly the Parable of the Older Son. The prodigal, wandering son merely sets the stage for the older son.

What Jesus is teaching is that the Jewish Nation is the older son, and the Gentiles are represented by the prodigal son. The Father represents God, who is about to welcome the Gentiles into full fellowship after centuries living in foolishness and wickedness. This seemingly unfair treatment was about to be as much as a shock to the Jewish people as killing the fatted calf for the prodigal son was to the older son.

Jesus reinforces this in the parable of the laborers in Matthew 20, where the landowner hired laborers early in the morning, on the third hour, on the sixth hour, on the nineth hour, and on the eleventh hour; and all were paid the exact same wage. Basically, the landowner (God) says it is his money to do with as he pleases.

We have a similar situation today when someone can be a faithful Christian all their lives but will receive the same reward as someone who becomes a Christian later in life after decades of sinful living. Jesus, in this parable, is instructing us to make sure we do not act like the older son, but instead have a Christian attitude of joy for those who find Him at any stage of life, or who return after they have fallen away.

Most churches regularly sing songs of God's faithfulness. But what is faithfulness as a "fruit of the Spirit"? The word faithfulness means trusting in something. Unless we know His precepts, we can't be faithful to them.


Unless we are filled with and practice this fruit of the Spirit, faithfulness, we may wander away from following God's laws. Faithfulness is knowing and obeying God, keeping on keeping on. Faithfulness means continuing to show through our lives the other fruits of the Spirit. Trusting in all the attributes of God allows us to live out our faithfulness to Him for others to see.

Faithfulness is demonstrated through loyalty to friends, duties performed, promises kept, commitments fulfilled, contracts completed, vows observed and being true to one's word, living our lives as servants to God and to our neighbors: the first and second, and greatest, commandments.

Galatians 6:7-9 Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, this he will also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary.

DEEDS OF THE FLESH: ADVENTURE

The opposite of faithfulness is unfaithfulness. Unfaithfulness is what Satan wants to temp you to do, but he doesn't say it that way. He would lead you to believe that faithfulness is a slow, boring lifestyle which dampens the adventure of life. Perhaps they are sexually inhibited, prone to drink, want to spend nights out with others, or can't control their spending. thing that life throws at us.



IMPOSSIBLE FOR EVOLUTION #132 - CAPILLARY SPHINCTERS

My blood pressure medicine was recently changed and my feet became so swollen that I couldn't get any of my shoes on. Swelling feet clearly means that liquid is accumulating in your feet, but what is there about a medicine which would cause liquid to accumulate in your feet?

In our issue 110 we discussed that flow thru your capillaries is very restricted due to their small size. The pressure near the supplying artery is high and causes the plasma to flow out into the muscle tissue. The pressure near the receiving vein is low. This causes the blood plasma to flow out into the muscle tissue to feed the muscle and then flow back into the capillary near the end. When the blood plasma is in the muscles it is called interstitial fluid.

Swelling feet would mean that an excess amount of plasma was flowing out of the ca-


pillaries (too much pressure in the capillaries near the artery) or too little plasma was flowing back into the capillaries (too much pressure in the capillaries near the vein). What mechanism is there which would cause either of these? This was not a long term situation to develop, the new blood pressure medicine did it quickly. See graphic to the right.

Last month we discussed sphincters which are muscles around an opening which contract to control flow. We made an incidental remark that your millions of capillaries have a tiny sphincter at the beginning of each of them to control the pressure in them.

The existence of the tiny sphincters is not surprising, but what is interesting is the ability to control pressure. To control pressure, you need to measure it in some way. After you measure it, you must send a signal to the sphincter to adjust to cause the pressure in the capillary to be regulated in the right pressure range. Then you must monitor and adjust it continuously.

How in the world would you accidentally come up with a means for measuring the pressure in capillaries, much less control tiny sphincters to regulate it. This has to be a massive and massively complex system for millions of capillaries. Surely this is a job for a really intelligent designer.

Now back to my feet swelling. If the new blood pressure medicine dampened the signals to the sphincters causing them to relax too much, they



would allow too much blood pressure in the capillaries or the capillary bed as shown in the illustration below. This could cause more plasma to flow into the surrounding tissue than would flow back into the capillaries near the vein end. Too much interstitial fluid (plasma) in the muscle tissue equals swelling.

That this works this way is a personal conclusion. If anyone has a better explanation, let us know and we will print it.





MANAGEMENT BY COMMITTEE

In some small businesses, decisions are often made by top-tier management. In really small companies, everyone may be encouraged to offer their opinion. It's called decision by committee, in which decisions are made based on input from a group of people – people who tend not to agree. Over the years, decision by committee has been considered a time-waster. Sure, every committee member has the right to an opinion, but not all opinions are of equal veracity and validity; in fact, many uninformed opinions are dead wrong.

So what are the negatives and positives of making decisions by committee? It's not ALL bad when used judiciously.

The Positives of Business Decisions by Committee

Not all committee decisions are wrong-headed. There are some excellent reasons to encourage decision by committee.

Avoiding extremes is often a benefit of decision by committee. As the stakeholders discuss options, the voices of reason discard the most extreme positions. Too risky. Too sketchy. Too many variables. Too much or too little something.

Decision by committee delivers numerous opinions from many different points of view. A committee can put on the brakes if it looks like a critical decision is going to take the company over the cliff. Moderate voices become louder and more influential as the risks of change are discussed and analyzed. Decision by committee encourages input. Sure, you may own the company, or manage it. You're the boss, the decision-maker. However, you may not be the best one to make a specific decision, especially one that involves something highly technical. It's usually best to get feedback from people in your company who are most familiar with the issue and/or will be most affected by it.

Example? "Should we invest \$50,000 in proprietary software designed for our company?" The employees who'll feel the impact of the new software are likely to be the most vocal. Get all the input you need and make the decision based on your team's expertise. Chances are, you'll take a moderate course forward and avoid unforeseen mistakes before they're even made.

The key is to control participation, to set the rules for discussion, to direct the conversation to avoid going off on a tangent. The boss will usually make the final decision based on the expert advice from the staff.

You're more likely to get buy-in for the decision if it comes from a group affected by that decision. Decisions reached after discussions and input from many different areas are more likely to be accepted than decisions that come down from "on high" without a vetting process. Those who were involved in the decision-making process can become advocates to support the decision that was reached.

The Negatives of Decision by Committee

There are a lot of them.

First, employees are more likely to suggest outrageous, reckless solutions because the responsibility for the decision is spread across the entire committee. This dilution of individual responsibility can generate some very bad decisions without fear of retribution.

Missing the best advice. If opinions are flying around the conference table, you and the team may miss the one suggestion that makes absolute, unqualified sense, lost in the discussion babble. Often, there will be a lone voice of reason willing to stand up and say what should be done. If the other 15 attendees disagree, that suggestion dries up and blows away.

Decision by committee can be a waste of time. It's easy to get bogged down when committee factions take opposing views and attempt to convince the other side of the table of the wisdom of their position. This can suck up time like a vacuum cleaner if you don't manage committee meetings.

Peer pressure comes into play quite frequently. At least some members of the decision committee are likely to go along with the consensus to avoid standing out, or worse, looking like a trouble maker.

Competing positions may lead to disharmony. There's a tendency for committee members to take positions and hold on to those decisions and defend them no matter how bad that decision is. Getting these hard-liners to budge can waste time and create ill-will. You hear both sides, make your choice, and annoy the heck out the committee members who felt the other "way" was better.

It's Up to You

Gather information from committee members. Listen to how each manager is impacted. Ultimately, it's your decision as the business owner. Don't let decision by committee bog down business operations. Used properly, decision by committee may prevent costly mistakes and lead to a moderate solution to the topic of discussion. Make the choice based on sound, impartial advice from your staff, consultants, even your business bank specialist. Take ideas from everyone. Then, make the best decision for the company.


