The ease of simply meeting in someone's home, thus a home church, is a natural way to begin a congregation. Home churches offer a number of benefits:

- 1. Almost everyone will tend to be involved.
- Most prospects may be within a small geographical radius, so inviting guests would not imply a long drive to a congregational building..

Some drawbacks of home churches are:


- Pretty much everyone <u>must</u> be involved to survive.
- There is a size limitation on the number of attendees who can reasonably fit in a home.
- 3. There is loss of inherent advertising without having a building with which to identify
- 4. Kid's programs tend to be very limited. This could be helped if multiple home churches work together. Teenagers could socialize with a local larger congregation in a building.
- Lack of critical mass (with associated budgeting) to hire permanent staff, support missionary efforts, or to have multiple shepherds. Having a good preacher or song leader would be problematic in many or most instances.

As a home church grows, the choices would be to start multiple home churches or to move to a facility which would house more attendees. This could be a rented facility such as an elementary school or hotel, or could be your own building.

Being in a larger facility seems to be the typical move with numerous advantages, and would allow for growth of the congregation.

Over time in the typical congregation, there is a tendency for the motivated members of the home church to become simply an audience. Many of our congregations are in decline and will die soon. Some congregations are dedicated to doing what worked 50 years ago, but is not working today. Observations would say that there is a relatively common pattern in church growth/decline results. The following graphic represents what happens to many congregations. They start off hot and growing; after a while, they become lukewarm and the growth levels off, and then they go through a cold stage and die. Many of our congregations are in the cold stage and declining in attendance today.

In these congregations, the leaders in charge are typically convinced that things they are doing are the appropriate things to be doing. Someone might suggest doing something else (scriptural). However, the present leaders are in control and typically continue on their same pathway.

The CORPORATE LIFE CYCLE graphic from the Barbarians to Bureaucrats book shows a similar curve for many businesses. It charac-

terizes those who build a church being Prophets, Barbarians, and Builder & Explorers. Synergists administer flatline businesses. Administrators, Bureaucrats, and Aristocrats maintain control as the business dies. The curve is very similar to the church growth curve with different names. The Bar-

barians to Bureaucrats book is an excellent book to read to help understand the relationships between leaders and followers. It is available on Amazon.

What that generally says is that anyone with the inclination to help start a new home church or a new brick & mortar church is functionally a "barbarian". Similarly, we will refer to those in charge of a declining church as a "bureaucrat".

It is likely that no one wants to be called either a barbarian or a bureaucrat, but lacking better names we will use them in this article.

The point of this is that when a congregation is in the cold part of the growth cycle, all that can be done to restore the congregation to a growth pattern needs to be done. It needs to be the first priority. However, history tells us that this is very difficult to do. If you characterize that


the "bureaucrats" are in charge, the "bureaucrats" are not likely to become 'barbarians". As the "bureaucrats" in charge functionally appoint new leaders, it is likely that future leaders will be "bureaucrats" also.

What does that say to you if you are in the graph position of being a "barbarian" and want to see changes to help the church grow? Observations of history says you cannot wait until the "bureaucrats" stop being bureaucrats. The most likely outcome is a continued decline until the congregation goes out of existence. A com-

mercial example of this is Church's Fried Chicken, which is in decline. Even though Chick-fil-A has provided a good growth model, Church's has been unable or unwilling to adapt. Sears, Bed Bath & Beyond, Radio Shack, Kodak, Blockbuster, and Toys R Us are other com-

panies which have gone out of business. Many of our congregations are similarly "going out of business."

Is it acceptable to do nothing for the rest of your life because your Brick & Mortar Church of Christ is in decline? What can you do if you are that "barbarian" and want to help make something happen in a bureaucratic world, after you have made your best efforts to help the Brick & Mortar Church of Christ where you are? If you have the ability to do more, it should not be acceptable not to do more.

A home church may be your answer. It is likely that the shrinking congregation is mostly comprised of older members and is in an older part of town. You always have the option of starting a home church in a newer, growing part of town a good distance away from your present Brick & Mortar Church of Christ. You don't require anyone's permission.

Starting a home church is as simple as preparing a weekly lesson, getting someone to lead singing, getting someone to pray, and getting communion supplies. If you are reading this you are likely capable of doing any of these activities. What happens next depends a lot on who else you can convince to attend.

If you are a "barbarian" in a congregation controlled by "bureaucrats", the "bureaucrats" are probably tired of listening to you. They might be happy to see you go. New churches have historically been planted in geographical areas needing a closely located church. A closely located church has the potential to reach out to the nearby community to share the Gospel, rather than counting on growth by taking existing members away from an existing congregation.

PRESENT RESOUCES

Most of our efforts have been focused on restoring declining congregations. Most of the things which would tend to restore a congregation would also be useful for starting a home church.

Also, there are 72 paperless hymnal songs online for free download and use at https:// www.paperlesshymnal.com/tph/free/

freesongs.htm. That should be plenty of songs to get you started.

FUTURE RESOURCES

Additionally, we are starting a project to provide worship service pieces that a home church can use to present a worship service when there are not enough talented leaders available. Some of the things we are planning to prepare are:

Recording the 72 available paperless hymnal songs in videos. They will show the words while recording a singing congregation. They will also show the song leader with the directing arm movements.

Collecting individual sermons. We will be parsing video sermons out of existing online sermons, with permission.

Collecting video communion services either from online services or possibly generate specific ones.

Collecting video prayers, including opening, contribution, and closing.

Collecting video welcome greetings.

In addition to the pieces of a worship service, we will be providing complete worship services as a single video. All a congregation will need to do is play it without needing to join the pieces together.

To accomplish these goals is a major project. If you know of anyone already providing these resources or if you are willing to help us collect resources, let us know bbaugh@occg.institute.

Typically, in a home church the preparation of the lessons is a major time-consuming task for

even the most committed members. With this assistance, a quality video service would easily be able to be presented and you can focus your time on personal evangelism.



IMPOSSIBLE FOR EVOLUTION #135 - PITCHER PLANT

Pitcher plants are <u>carnivorous plants</u> that have modified leaves known as **pitfall traps**. A prey-trapping mechanism featuring a deep cavity filled with digestive <u>liquid</u>. The plants attract and drown their prey with nectar.

Foraging, flying, or crawling insects such as flies are attracted to a cavity formed by the cupped leaf, often by visual lures and nectar. Many pitcher plants exhibit patterns of ultraviolet coloration which may play a role in attracting insects. Some species use camouflage to trap insects. Their coloration matches that of the surrounding environment.


Olfactory cues can also play a role in attraction. For example, *Nepenthes rafflesian*a uses flower-scent mimicry to attract insects to its pitchers.

The rim of the pitcher is slippery when moistened by condensation or nectar, causing insects to fall into the trap. The walls of the pitfall may be covered with waxy scales, protruding crystals, cuticular folds, downward-pointing hairs, or lunate cells, to help prevent escape. The small bodies of liquid contained within the pitcher traps are phytotelmata. They drown the insect, whose body is gradually dissolved. This may occur by bacterial action, or by digestive enzymes secreted by the plant itself. Pitcher trap fluids vary in their viscoelasticity and acidity, which then dictates which type of prey they can target. Increased viscoelasticity promotes insect retention to help capture flying insects such as flies. Increased fluid acidity decreases insect killing-time to help capture crawling insects such as ants. Some pitcher plants contain insect larvae, which feed on trapped prey, and whose excreta the plant absorbs.

Pitcher plants grow in tropical habitats in warm locations like Australia, Madagascar, and South Pacific Islands. American pitcher plants (Sarracenia) have a different shape of pitcher, and grow in wetland areas in the east-

ern part of the US and Canada.

Can you imagine a plant which can form an upward facing pitcher shape, fill the bottom with digestive fluids, put an umbrella on the top to keep rain water out, secret scents to attract insects, and be so slippery on the sides that insects fall into the digestive fluids? That is not a bunch of accidents of evolution. It is the plan of an intelligent designer. That intelligent designer is God!
