It is a conservative Bible based program, as Oklahoma Christian University is.

Many of our smaller congregations have few men available to conduct the services, and the

work of putting on the services frequently consumes all their available time. Frequently actual shepherding and personal evangelism are neglected.

COC WORSHIP SERVICES provides complete worship services for Sunday AM and

Sunday PM. They come from Church of Christ congregations which record their services. They are edited to remove references to the originating congregation and to be in a standard format. To the greatest extent possible, the services are tailored to give the feeling that they are focused _____

on your local congregation.

They are characteristically built with a welcome, 2 songs, a prayer, 1 or 2 songs, communion, a song, a scripture reading, a sermon, and invitation song, a

pause, a closing song, and a closing prayer. During the pause, the local congregation will take over to handle responses, do local announcements and their collection.

The timing of the services presumes the congregation uses the prepackaged com-













munion sets and will show the pretaking senter communion. If the local congregation distributes multi-cup trays, the video will be paused after the bread and wine prayers and then restarted to provide time for distribution of the

trays.

To the greatest extent possible, the videos try to always show the music and the song leader and provide well-known songs.

This program is not intended to allow non-involvement of members in various congregations, but rather to allow the available time to be used more creatively, i.e. personal evangelism.

YOUTH MINISTER

A key factor in sustainability is having youth attend. Resources which might have been spent on a mature preacher can be spent on a youth minister. A youth minister can have

a substantial impact on the nature of classes, VBS, youth trips, and other activities which can help bring other youth (and their families) to your congregation.

As we said before, this program is intended primarily to assist smaller congregations with their worship services. That being said, there are other potential uses of this service:


- As a temporary resource when you are between preachers.
- If your regular preacher is sick or goes on vacation, it can be a filling preacher or service. The worship services are posted as entire services and sermons only to give

you a choice.

If you are homebound, you will have a large selection of services to watch.

What it is not intended for is to discourage church attendance. We are instructed to meet together when possible and the fellowship of meeting together is invaluable. Hebrews 10:25: "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another and all the more as you see the Day approaching".

FUTURE EXPANSION

THERE ARE SUNDAY MORNING AND SUNDAY EVENING SERVICES POSTED FOR ALL OF 2024!

Sermons, welcomes, and prayers are most easily integrated into the services. Songs need to show the song leader and words most of the time and be reasonably traditional songs. Communion preferably shows the leader taking communion. If you take the time to distribute multi-cup trays, the time will be edited out as if everyone uses the small, packaged communion sets.

HOUSE CHURCHES, P1

"Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am in the midst of them," Matthew 18:20

WHAT IS A HOUSE CHURCH?

A house church describes a group of Christians who regularly gather for worship in their private homes. It may be part of a larger church body or an independent group.

WERE HOUSE CHURCHES COMMON IN THE FIRST CENTURY?

Yes. In the early church, fellowship, prayer, and worship took place mainly in private homes. This continued for 300 years until Constantine became the Roman emperor.

DOES THE BIBLE SPEAK OF HOUSE CHURCH-ES?

Yes. Five times the Bible mentioned churches that met in homes.

Acts 1:13 Jesus' disciples met in the "upper room" of a house.

1 Corinthians 16:19; Romans 16:3-5 In the house of Pricilla and Aquila mentioned two times. "The churches of Asia greet you, especially Priscilla and Aquilla greet you much in the Lord, along with the church that meets in their house.

Colossians 4:15 "Greet the brethren in Laodicea, and Nymphas, and the church that is in their house."

Philemon 1:2 "To Philemon our dear friend and follow worker - Also to Apphia our sister and Arcgippus our fellow soldier - and to the church that meets in their home."

WHAT A HOUSE CHURCH IS NOT?

1. A NEW CONCEPT. It was common in the first three hundred years of the church and is

common throughout the world today.

- 2. A new denomination. The lord's church is undenominational. The Bible is our only guide and rule of faith.
- 3. Meant to exclude or replace traditional churches. Both are needed.
- 4. A church without biblical leadership. As the church grows it appoints Shepherds and deacons. Each House Church is self governing.
- 5. A means for families to isolate themselves from other believers. Developing deeper fellowship with other believers is one of the strengths of House Churches.

REASONS FOR HOUSE CHURCHES TODAY

- It is proven effective for evangelism. Many people would not go to a church building but would met in a home.
- 2. Many are looking for a close, loving church free of the restraints of meeting in a church building. As in Acts 2:46 the early church was "Breaking bread from house to house. They ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart."
- 3. House churches allow each member to contribute to the worship and Bible study. The Apostle Paul admonished the Corinthian church "whenever you come together, each of you has a psalm, a teaching" I Cor14:36.
- 4. House churches often are able to give 100% of their contribution to the needy and evangelism instead of the average traditional church giving most for the building and staff.
- 5. It is a very effective atmosphere for growing in discipleship of every member.

DO HOUSE CHURCHES NETWORK AND COOP-ERATE WITH OTHER HOUSE CHURCHES AND **TRADITIONAL CHURCHES?**

Absolutely. We are brothers and sisters in Christ and work together to further the cause of Christ. Sometimes several churches can work together to accomplish what we could not do on our own

DO HOUSE CHURCHES HAVE PAID EMPLOY-EES?

Generally speaking "no". Due to the size and mission of House churches paying someone to do all the speaking is not considered best. However, part time or full time employees may be hired to help with the mission of the church in discipleship, evangelism and works of service.

DIES A HIRED MINISTER DELIVER ALL THE SER-MONS?

With the advent of the internet and video (e.g. COC Worship Services), a church can have the most gifted speakers in the world speak to the church at little expense. If the church pays an employee we would have them work directly on one-on-one discipling, works of service, and evangelism.

DOES NOT THE HOUSE CHURCH MOVEMENT MAKE THE TRADITIONAL CHURCH DECLINE **PROBLEM WORSE?**

There are many reasons why church attendance is declining causing churches to close. Some of these problems causing the decline is solved by house churches.

Multitudes want a simpler, more biblical church with deeper fellowship, more outreach to the needy and lost, without the usual baggage that many traditional churches have. Traditional

churches generally resist the changes necessary to solve their declining number problems.

WHAT HAPPENS IF A HOUSE CHURCH GROWS **BEYOND WHAT CAN BE ACCOMMODATED IN A HOUSE?**

It is the goal of house churches to obey Jesus' instruction to make disciples of al nations. When the church grows to the point it cannot be accommodated in a house (usually about 20-25), a new house church planting is sponsored in another part of town or a surrounding town. The starting of new churches has shown to be a very effective way to lead others to Christ.

WHAT IS YOUR WORSHIP SERVICE LIKE?

As is taught in the New Testament, the worship service consists of singing, scripture reading, individual sharing ("a psalm or a teaching"), Bible study, prayers, a sermon, the Lord's supper, contribution, and fellowship. Participation of every member is encouraged.

IS THE HOUSE CHURCH FOR EVERYONE"?

No. House churches are not for everyone. In many parts of the world where the church is persecuted, it is the only choice. We can be thankful living in America we still have the freedom to choose our place of worship.

There are advantages to the traditional church structure and to the house church as mentioned in this article. We are all part of the body of Christ and can be united in a common cause for making disciples of all nations.

IMPOSSIBLE FOR EVOLUTION #147: SEX: DIVING BELL SPIDERS

If a spider gets into the water, it drowns. They are air breathers.

Image first a spider developing millions of rough water repellant hairs all around its abdomen, each with a waxy coating. When it sticks its abdomen into the air it traps a layer of air called a plastron. See the figure to the right.

Spiders have a Book Lung in their lower abdomen making it convenient to breathe from the plastron. That would let the spider survive underwater for a period of time, based on what is their personal tank of air.

Next imagine that a spider can build a silk underwater house or cave which allows the spider to make several trips to the surface to collect plastrons of air and then release the air into the cave to fill it. See lower figure.

The spider constructs the underwater cave in such a way that when the oxygen gets low inside, some oxygen will cross the boundary from the water and CO2 will exit just like a human lung.

The spider would have the additional ability to detect when the oxygen in the underwater cave is getting low and can take the stale air to the surface and release it and bring fresh air back down.

Turns out such a spider exists. The diving bell spider or water spider (Argyroneta aquatica) is the only species of spider known to live almost entirely under water. It is the only member of the genus Argyroneta. When out of the water, the spider ranges in color from mid to dark brown, although the hairs on the abdomen give it a dark grey, velvet-like appearance.

A. aquatica is the only known species of spider that spends almost all its life underwater, including resting, catching and eating prey, mating, egg laying, and overwintering. It only briefly surfaces to replenish its oxygen supply and occasionally will bring prey to the surface.

A. aquatica is found in clean freshwater habitats with aquatic vegetation, such as lakes, ponds, canals, marshes

and slow-moving streams. It ranges through much of mainland Europe, the British Isles and central to northern Asia ranging as far south as Iran and as far north as Siberia.

The spiders prey on aquatic insects and crustaceans such as mosquito larvae and water fleas. The spiders themselves fall prey to frogs and fish.



The question is whether a spider can develop specialty hairs on its abdomen to make a plastron, know how to build an underwater silk cave, and then maintain the air quality inside it, or is this another proof of an intelligent designer giving a species new capabilities.

We would suggest this is a proof of God.


